


The alumni volunteer program also benefits our younger students, as they experience what's possible for them in the stages of their lives after graduating from ISP.




The Path Ahead

THE SPEAR CENTER

at the International School of Portland

The Deloris A. Spear Center for Excellence in Teaching aims to serve as the hub for educational innovation and professional learning.

Established in 2019 with an endowed leadership gift by the Don and Lone Spear Family, the Spear Center for Excellence in Teaching is home to workshops and conferences with world-renowned educators to support not only our own ISP community but also international educators from the Portland area and beyond.

The first of its kind in the nation, The Spear Center aims to fill a significant gap in high-quality professional development opportunities for teachers working in language immersion and inquiry-based teaching.

Already a leader in the field of international education, ISP's creation of the Spear Center plays a critical role in the next chapter of the school as it advances towards its vision of becoming "a renowned center of excellence in multicultural education."

In Fall of 2021, ISP was awarded a \$246,000 grant from the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust in support

of the Spear Center. The grant is funding the new position, Head of Professional Learning, to lead the center's programming and growth (See the side box for information on our new Head of Professional Learning!).

Under this new leadership, the Spear Center will host a fall inquiry conference for 200 educators across the county headlined by Kath Murdoch, Trevor Mackenzie, Stephanie Harvey, and Kimberly Mitchell. Participants will be led in a 2-day dive into crafting inquiry-based early childhood, elementary, and middle school classrooms.

Gathering together again in celebration of our school



After two years of uncertainty and caution, we were delighted to see so many traditions, school events, and day to day activities come back to life as restrictions eased. The eagerness of every community member to be together was evident in every smile and hug as we gathered.

Here are some of the ways we gathered together again in celebration and support of our school and community.

Vision Campaign

The Vision Campaign was born out of input from our community as well as feedback from community members who took part in strategic planning and admissions research. Currently in the second phase of the 30-month campaign, the campaign's final goal is to elevate ISP's prominence in the local and global communities by means of community outreach and exposure, public relations, increased growth in the Doloris A. Spear Center for Teaching Excellence and comprehensive fundraising campaigns.

As pandemic restrictions eased in the spring, we were able to accomplish a significant number of the tasks set forth in the campaign. Our Head of School, board members, and administration continued their engagement with other regional educational, cultural and leadership organizations and re-initiated connections with our current families.

Our families, many of whom began their time at ISP in the middle of COVID, were eager to meet other parents in their children's classes. ISP hosted grade level coffees where parents socialized with other parents, senior administration, staff and our Head of School. Additional gatherings included small social events for grandparents and a casual social event for parents in our Mandarin Track.



Classroom and Curriculum News

Student-Led Conferences

A Celebration of Learning

Families were invited to join their child in their classroom this spring to celebrate their academic successes. Since this was the first time our parents had been inside our buildings since March 2020, parents were eager to see firsthand what their student was accomplishing academically.

Completely led by the student, these conferences were an opportunity for our students to take ownership of their work and demonstrate their learning to their families.

A common practice at PYP schools around the world, this was something new and exciting for ISP.

Exhibition

Fifth graders at International School of Portland work hard to prepare for the IB Exhibition, the culminating event for PYP students. A special Unit of Inquiry designed and executed by the students themselves, the students write lines of inquiry, gather data, conduct investigations, take action, and present this experience in a public forum. The public forum during COVID involved online presentations.

This year, under the guidance of PYP Coordinator Kelly Rogers, our fifth graders proudly immersed their classmates, other ISP students and their friends and family with their creative presentations over two days, including a special evening event where parents and grandparents were invited to participate. Our student body was excited to experience Exhibition firsthand.

Spring Events at ISP

Moving For Music & Art

We are proud to offer comprehensive art and music programs to all students. All proceeds from our annual MMA event benefit our music and art classes and support the entire annual budget for materials and programming.

Over the course of two days in April, and in a renewed partnership with the Parent Network, we successfully brought back our annual jog-a-thon fundraiser.

We were humbled by the many ways our students, friends and families contributed to this event. Students ran over 8,000 laps and parents, friends and grandparents contributed over \$32,000 making this our most successful MMA event in school history.

Over 50 eager volunteers signed up to help - not to mention the countless parents who showed up to cheer on our runners.

Grandparent & Special Friends Event

All of us at ISP value the importance of the rich and diverse relationships that our students have with their grandparents and special friends. In May, we welcomed these guests to

campus for our annual Grandparent and Special Friends Event.

In addition to enjoying tea, students and their guests shared time with ISP staff, created bookmarks and explored the ISP library with school librarians.

As part of this special event, grandparents and special friends helped us to raise important funds for our library which will enable the school to purchase over 150 new books for our multilingual collection.

Handshaking Tradition

Twice each school year, we gather on the playground to shake hands and share warm greetings with each member of the ISP community. This tradition, initiated by former school head Bruce Bayliss in 2001, had been on pause due to the pandemic.

For the first time since 2019, we were excited to bring back this beloved school tradition. On the last day of school, staff, parents and grandparents, along with ISP founders Doug and Frey Stearns, gathered on the lower playground to congratulate and shake hands with our graduating fifth graders, wishing them well on their next adventures. It was a tradition we had greatly missed, and welcomed back with open arms (and hand sanitizer!).
